

### Write to your Representative or Senator

Act locally by writing letters or emails—to support a cause you care about—to representatives and senators from your state. In a single-page letter, focus on one issue. Try three paragraphs like this:

1. Introduce yourself and say why you're writing. Include your address and contact information so they can respond.



### 7 Steps to Building a Bird Feeder

MATERIALS:

- Any size peanut butter jar
- Wire coat hanger
- Pencil
- · Birdseed

TOOLS:

- Knife
- Drill & bits (optional)

TIME:

1 hour

STEPS:

- 1. Remove the lid and cut or drill a hole through the centershould be large enough for a wire coat hanger.
- 2. Straighten the hanger and place it through the lid.
- 3. Two inches from the one end, make a 90° bend. On the same end, add one more bend. At the other end of the hanger, make a hook.



### **Project cards**

- Give details about how your topic affects you and your community. If your issue involves a certain bill, include the title and number. Use specific examples.
- 3. End your letter with the action you want to see happen: a vote for or against a bill or a change in policy. Remember to thank them for their time!

- One inch from the bottom of the jar, make two holes (on opposite sides) for the pencil (feeder perch) to pass through.
- One inch above the perch holes, cut a feeder opening. Make the hole slightly larger than a quarter.
- 6. Slide in the feeder perch and add birdseed.
- 7. Place the lid on top and hang it up.
